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Joseph Grinn & wife This Indenture, Made the Twenty first day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty Between Joseph Grinn of Sisterville his Township Armstrong County State of Pennsylvania and Elizabeth his wife of the first part, and John George of the Township County and State aforesaid party of the second part witness that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of eighteen dollars lawful money of the United States States, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part at or before the ensualing or delivery hereof, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released and confirmed unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns. All of that certain Piece or parcel of Land situate in Sisterville Township Armstrong County and State of Pennsylvania bounded and described as follows, Viz: Beginning at or opposite the house formerly occupied by John Gray running fourteen and one half Paces to a post handy to a Spring thence Eleven paces along John George's line to a sapling threee fourteen and one half paces towards their fence and thence eleven paces to the place of Beginning containing One acre more or less it being a piece of a larger tract of Land conveyed by Jonathan Mytton the sixteenth day of February A.D. 1838 unto John George and Joseph Grinn and the said John George conveying part of the said tract of Land to Joseph Grinn by Deed dated the twenty second day of November A.D. 1839, reference being had to the Records of Armstrong County and to the several Conveyances the title will more fully and at large appear.
